Sunday Mass: It is hard to believe that this is the 12th Sunday without the public celebration of Mass. Public worship (Phase 4 of the plan) is set to resume on the 20th of July but there is hope that this date will be brought forward as the number of people with Covid-19 has gone down in recent days. The Irish Bishops' are currently drawing up a document which will help parishes plan for the safe return to public Masses and the celebration of the sacraments.

Mass will be said on 3rd June by Monsignor Liam Kelly in the Cathedral of St Patrick and St Felim, Cavan at 18.30. This Mass will be celebrated for all Leaving Certificate students, their parents/guardians and teachers, of our diocese who were prevented from taking their Leaving Cert. examination on this day.
